School Council

6. TREASURER'S REPORT

October 2022 - Feb 2023 results:

Uniform Shop - still profitable, but 10% less YoY. Overall reduction in sales of 16%. Summer dress sales are down 30%. Nearly New Uniform Sale brough in \$2,800 up to Feb, and \$2,200 in this morning's Nearly New Uniform Sale.

Fundraising - raised \$5,000 thanks to End of Year picnic, Celebration bucket and Ladies Fashion Night.

Expenses - Audit fee, Injury Insurance premium, P&C Welcome Drinks.

Canteen - sales are up YoY (difficult to compare to previous similar periods due to just coming out of covid last comparable period). Supplier costs are rising. Gross profit margin has dropped from 42% to 38%. Wage costs are up. We are loss making by about \$2,500. This will mean that we have to put up some canteen prices on Flexischools and over the counter sales. We are generally charging less than comparable schools, as we are P&C run rather than outsourced to a third party. Volunteer numbers are good, but could be higher to help offset our wages cost.

7. SUB COMMITTEE REPORTS

a) UNIFORM SHOP

Uniform shop is now supplying PSSA and Year 6 shirts. Back to School Vouchers are still being accepted.

b) EVENTS AND FUNDRAISING

Colour Fun Run - we are almost at \$35,000 in fundraising and registrations are now at 634 out of 771 students, although a lot of registrations are at zero funds raised. SRC will visit classrooms to raise awareness and motivation and share fundraising tips. All students will be able to run, unless explicitly advised by their parents otherwise. It will also be a Mufti Day for students.

Easter Hunt Event - Tuesday 4th April - for Kindy and Year 1

Term 2 - upcoming events are Grandparents and Friends Day, Mother's Day Gift Stall and Mother's Day Dance.

c) CANTEEN

Prices will be going up due to reasons detailed in the Treasurer's Report.

8. OTHER BUSINESS

Premier's Grant for Outdoor Education - design draft of an outdoor seating area was circulated at the meeting. It is based on the design of a yarning circle and the Bailey whale.

9. SPONSORSHIP

Our primary sponsor for our Fun Run is Limes Dry Cleaners. As a Silver sponsor, they have donated \$2,500 to the P&C and will be present at the run next Friday 24th March to 'blow to starters whistle' and kick off the first race.

Other confirmed sponsors who are donating prizes for our various events this year include: Kwik Kopy Neutral Bay, Mosman Martial Arts Academy and BX1 Gym, Big Music Crows Nest, Taronga Zoo, Le Patissier, Verve Photography, Tinkertank, Gunners Barracks, Luna Park, Infinity Bakery, Youth Sports Australia, Mahona Wellbeing, Fab Lab Fashion, Sneaky Keys, Extol Gym, Crockd, Yindi Wellness, Merrigal Gifts and Bird & Bear Group who look after five venues around Sydney including locally Mosman Rowers, Flying Bear, Foys. We're working out the finer details with Bird & Bear but amongst other things like reduced cost function packages and food & beverage vouchers looks like we might be able to negotiate an "always on discount" for NBPS staff and families and that discount will be returned as a donation to our P&C.
