Neutral Bay Public School Parents and Citizens Association Annual Report 2022

NBPS P&C Association is pleased to report on its activities for 2022.

The following report covers the period from October 2021 through to September 2022 which is our reporting period.

The NBPS P&C Association fulfils a number of functions in the School community:

- as a forum for parent/School executive interaction and consultation with regular contributions from both the Principal & Deputy Principals;
- through the provision of funding for key educational and other resources, through fundraising activities;
- running the operations of two businesses which provide key services to the community (Canteen and Uniform Shop);
- organising social and other events for School families and the community;
- representing the views of, and providing information to the School community; and
- representing parents in interactions with our broader local community.

Funding Educational and other Resources

The primary objective of the P&C's fundraising activities is to direct funds raised toward enhancing the educational outcomes and experience for all students at the School. Accordingly, in the year to 30 September 2022, the P&C Association

contributed \$200,000 to the ongoing support of the Science, Music and Art programs at the School as well as the learning support programs (SLSO) for students (\$140,000). This year the P & C has funded the provision of furniture for the school's outdoor learning space, upgrade of canteen facilities and resourced the art program at NBPS. The Art Program was a highly successful initiative, where Ms Anna East worked with classes throughout the school to create the magnificent artworks auctioned in Term 3. It was not a typical year for funding as we are preparing for building works so could not purchase extra resources.

Voluntary Contributions

Voluntary contributions are the backbone of the P&C's fundraising efforts and I would like to thank the very generous support of all Neutral Bay families in 2022. I am pleased to report that we raised \$88,000 and these contributions help support the Music and Science programs which are not otherwise funded by the government.

Fundraising and Events

We worked around the challenges of COVID to organise a number of events with both a Community Development and Fundraising focus throughout the period.

Uniform Shop

It has been another busy year for the Uniform Shop.

We again thank Sylvia Seah whose tireless efforts and proactive assistance have helped fulfil countless orders, maintained a close eye on pricing and supply of uniforms and even increased our delivery so that we also supply uniforms for the School – including the Blazers for Captains and Vice Captains. Thanks also to Sylvia, Alice and Nada plus volunteers for a successful stocktake.

We would also like to acknowledge Tamia Gallego and her wonderful team of volunteers for their efforts in the smooth running of the "Nearly New" uniform sales. Neutral Bay Public School greatly appreciates the generosity of parents who donate quality pre-loved uniforms. This assists us in raising funds and also reducing land-fill.

The increased Nearly New sales per term is having a great impact on helping us turn over stock, We are pleased to continue to support parents who wish to purchase second-hand items and to promote recycling.

Total Uniform sales increased from \$134,000 to \$151,000 with a return to face-to-face learning at School.

The NBPS Canteen takes pride in creating healthy and tasty meals or snacks for the students and teachers at reasonable prices. The canteen team ensures a high standard of efficiency. The canteen is consistently regarded highly by the North Sydney Council in their annual Food Premises Inspection.
