He began the use of iPads at Neutral Bay and ran the one-to-one program in Year 6, which saw Neutral Bay as the first school in NSW to roll out this level of technology integration. Neutral Bay Public School became a leader in technology integration and ran open mornings for other schools to visit and view this innovative program in action.

Together with Mrs Collett, our ex-Principal, he managed the planning and building of our beloved Kindyland that many of you hold dear in your memories of Neutral Bay.

Mr Taylor also had an amazing sense of humour and was renowned for his 'crazy' socks. 






Stage 1 News (Years 1 & 2)

Stage 2 News (Years 3 & 4)

Year 3 loved their educational visit to the Botanical Gardens. Through hands on activities, we learnt about reducing our carbon footprint, reusing materials and natural resources, as well recycling. Year 3 learnt about the germination process of plants, how compost and worms help our gardens, as well as how water tanks work. We designed, created and tested our own mini water tanks! Year 3 also learnt about various artists who create three-dimensional art installations. Using natural resources, Year 3 used this new knowledge as inspiration to create their own art installations around the Botanical Gardens.












Stage 3 News (Years 5 & 6)

Communications Coordinator

Canteen Coordinator

The Canteen Coordinator is responsible for:

- Ensuring liaison between the Canteen Manager and the P&C;
- Managing volunteer parent helpers;
- Organising and chairing Canteen sub-committee meetings (approximately two meetings per term);
- Plus: stocktaking; promotion of special days; promotion of healthy canteen policy.

President & Vice President

The President is responsible for:

- The successful functioning of the NBPS P&C Association meetings;
- The attainment of the NBPS P&C Association's objectives and consistently following the constitution;
- Ensuring that the NBPS P&C Association takes part in decision-making processes in the School and maintaining lines of communication with the Principal;
- Fostering fair participation of all members; welcoming new members and supporting volunteers;
- Acting as the P&C Association's spokesperson when public statements or actions are needed;
- Being signatory on the NBPS P&C Association's bank accounts.

Vice Presidents are responsible for:

- Assisting the President in the tasks listed above;
- Chairing meetings in the absence of the President.

Fundraising and Events Coordinating Team (2-3)

This position is best split into two roles – Fundraising Coordinator and Events Coordinator.

The Fundraising Coordinator is responsible for:

- Establishing and maintaining sponsorship relationships with local businesses;
- Planning and running the annual fundraiser typically an Auction in odd years and a Carnival during even years;

• Assisting the Events Coordinator.

The Events Coordinator is responsible for:

- Setting up Class Contact lists, and helping Class and Year Coodinators maintain their Class Contact lists:
- Planning and running a number of events throughout the year including community building events such as the Welcome Picnic, and Mother's and Father's Day events, and assisting with the annual fundraiser;
- Communicating to the parent body on behalf of the P&C via newsletters, pupil post and school newsletter.

Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer

The Treasurer is responsible for:

- Receiving and depositing monies, maintaining records, drawing cheques, authorising payments and presenting accounts;
- Ensuring that all funds held and handled by NBPS P&C are properly and openly accounted for (including all P&C Association committees). This does not mean that the Treasurer must undertake the actual bookkeeping her/himself, but she/ he must ensure that the various sub-committee financial records have been kept adequately;
- Being signatory on the P&C accounts and should not delegate this responsibility;
- Encouraging members to understand the state of the P&C Association finances;
- Ensuring a case book or books are kept, recording all financial transactions of the P&C Association;
- Working with the sub-committee treasurers and an assistant treasurer; - Whilst all P&C members must be mindful of complying with financial accountability requirements, this is the Treasurer's primary responsibility.

Assistant Treasurer

- The Assistant Treasurer is responsible for:
- Maintaining the P&C Membership register and monitor who is allowed to vote when
- Primary person responsible for depositing cash receipts (having co-counted with the Treasurer or the Treasurer's delegate) and needs to be present at all fundraising events where cash is being taken;
- Delegated to co-approve any general or fundraising expenses with the Treasurer;
- Liaise with the Uniform Shop team to ensure invoices are paid as required.













