

Principal's News

Wellbeing

At Neutral Bay Public School, we measure wellbeing in different ways. One way the Department of Education measures wellbeing is through the Tell Them From Me survey. This is a survey of students, teachers and parents. Wellbeing is made up of a **sense of belonging, expectations of success and advocacy** in the Tell Them From Me survey. In relation to these three areas, **students reported:**

- 87% Expectations for success (at state average)
- 78% Sense of belonging (below state average)
- 78% Advocacy (by teachers for students) at school (above state average)

In relation to wellbeing, students also reported:

- 89% Positive wellbeing, which has increased from 85% in 2019.
- 93% Positive behaviour at school (above state average)
- 84% Positive teacher-student relationships is (at state average)

In relation to wellbeing, parents reported:

85% - My child is clear about rules for school behaviour (state average)
84% - My child feels safe going to and from school (above state average)
70% - Teachers help students develop positive friendships (above state average)


