

#### **ICAS ASSESSMENTS - YEARS 3-6**

Neutral Bay Public School will participate in the ICAS Assessments again this year.

ICAS Assessments are online, designed to recognise academic excellence and are rigorous in nature. Students are assessed on their ability to apply classroom learning to new contexts using higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics and Science.

The cost per test is \$19.25, including GST. Entry is optional.

You will need the school's unique access code, which is **NWS991**.

#### Investing in our achools

The NSW Covernment is investing \$7.9 billion over the next four years, continuing its program to deliver 215 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

The NSW Department of Education is committed to delivering new and upgraded schools for communities across NSW. The delivery of these important projects is essential to the future learning needs of our students and supports growth in the local economy.

#### Project overview

The upgrade of Neutral Bay Public School has been funded to deliver.

- 19 new flexible learning spaces
- Improvements to the library, administration/staff areas, canteen, amenities and storage facilities
- Increased play space
- Improved out of school hours care facilities.

#### Progress surranary

Design Inc has been awarded the architect contract to develop the project's schematic designs.

The designs will be submitted as part of the project's Development Application to North Sydney Council in July 2022.

#### Community information sessions

Parents, carers and the community are invited to attend a community information session at the school to view and comment on the planned upgrade works. Two sessions will be held:

230 pm to 330 pm Thursday 23 June and 8 am to 930 am Friday 24 June 2022.


