- Navy and white checked pattern tunic worn with white, long-sleeved polo shirt featuring school logo. Alternatively, the white, longsleeved polo shirt featuring the school logo may be worn with long navy pants.
- Long navy pants are preferred to shorts.
- A sleeveless navy vest with zip front featuring the school logo, a long-sleeved polar-fleeced jumper featuring the school logo or a navy sloppy joe featuring the school logo may be worn.
- Black shoes are worn with navy tights or short white socks.

Bovs - Winter Uniform

- White, long-sleeved polo shirt featuring the school logo is worn with long navy pants.
- Long navy pants are preferred to shorts.
- A sleeveless navy vest with zip front featuring the school logo, a long-sleeved, polar-fleeced jumper featuring the school logo or a navy sloppy joe featuring the school logo may be worn.
- Black shoes are worn with short white socks.
 Sport uniform House-coloured long or short-sleeved polo shirt featuring the school logo is worn with navy shorts, short white socks and shoes appropriate for the sport being played. In winter, school track suits may be worn over sports uniform.

Hats

A navy, broad-brimmed hat featuring the school logo is worn during all outdoor activities.

Footwear

Except for sport, black shoes are worn with all uniforms.

BOOK WEEK IS BACK!

Book Week is being celebrated this year from **Saturday 20 August to Friday 26 August.**

In the spirit of nurturing a love of reading and Australian literature, Neutral Bay Public School is organising a series of activities to help celebrate, promote and engage students in literature that tie in with the Book Week theme for 2022: 'Dreaming With Eyes Open'.

Reading Trail Monday:

Teachers across the school will read aloud their favourite stories in the playground. Students choose three great books to hear, then relax and enjoy!

Optional - students may bring a cushion or pillow to sit on and listen in comfort.

Pyjama Day Tuesday:

Wear your favourite pair of PJs to school and bring in a gold coin donation to help to raise vital funds to support the Indigenous Literacy Foundation. Wear enclosed shoes such as joggers (not slippers) for safety reasons, have covered shoulders and wear a hat. Remember to wear a dressing gown so you stay warm.'

Book Tasting Wednesday:

Students are asked to bring a favourite book to school on this day. They will 'taste' or sample different books in an extended reading session. This is a chance for students to read books they haven't tried before as well as different authors and reading genres.

• Transfiguration Thursday:

Students are asked to dress as their favourite book character and bring either the book or a copy of the front cover. Alternatively, they could dress in keeping with the Book Week theme 'Dreaming With Eyes Open'.
