## **BOOKMARK DESIGN COMPETITION**

Grab an entry form in person at Stanton Library or <u>download one here</u>. Entries can be submitted in person, via email, or uploaded online through the <u>online form</u>.

- Entrants must be aged between 3 18 years (inclusive) as of Sunday 21 August 2022.
- Each entry must be original work and completed on the competition template. It must include a completed entry form alongside the signature of the entrant's parent or guardian.
- Stanton Library is authorised to display and publish all entries. Entries cannot be returned once submitted.
- Stanton Library must receive each entry no later than **11:59pm on Sunday 21 August 2022**.

Winning entries will be announced during Children's Book Week, **from Saturday 20 - Friday 26 August 2022.** 

Winning designs will be made into bookmarks and distributed through Stanton Library. Each winner will receive 20 copies of their winning design bookmark and a book pack donated by Walker Books Australia.



## PARTIAL ABSENCES

Teacher quality is the single most important in-school factor influencing student achievement (Hattie, 2009). However, the relationship between teacher quality and student achievement is mediated by students' time in the classroom.

Arriving at school on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day.
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine.
- Give students time to greet their friends before class.
- Reduces classroom disruption.

Attendance is recorded each day. Staff (including casual staff) are trained in school procedures around partial absences. In the case of late arrival or early departure, the office must record the precise time of arrival or departure.

Students should present to the office with their parent/carer when they arrive at school after 9:10am or leave school before 3:15pm.

Students are expected to be at school for the whole school day. Where possible, appointments with doctors, dentists, etc., should be made outside school hours. If you need to collect your child during school hours, please come to the school office, where the absence will be recorded, and you will be issued a partial absence slip for your child.

Late arrival and early departure are recorded on our rolls with an unjustified code. This appears on school reports.

This term, our school will be participating in a trial of an SMS messaging system that sends a semi-automated daily text message to parents of children who present late to school without an explanation. This will ask parents to provide a reason for the absence. This system will also allow the school to inform parents quickly via SMS if unforeseen circumstances arise, such as a grade excursion running late. These texts will be sent from a dedicated number and are one way, meaning that our school maintains a consistent identity for SMS communications.

## SAVE THE DATE - SATURDAY 17 SEPTEMBER - ART AUCTION 'COLOUR MY WORLD'


